



RIVER TO RIVER: LOUISVILLE'S WATER CYCLE

Louisville Water Company and Louisville Metropolitan Sewer District are proud to offer *River to River: Louisville's Water Cycle* to students in grades 5-8.

Louisville Water and MSD work closely with one of our most precious natural resources. Every day, Louisville Water treats millions of gallons of Ohio River water and supplies drinking water; then, MSD treats the water again and returns it to the river. People use and dispose of water 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It's all part of Louisville's Water Cycle. *River to River* is a **free program** that explores what it takes to keep this cycle in motion.

This lesson is hands-on, content-driven and relates to the real-world. It is designed for one classroom period, approximately 60 minutes. We ask that the number of students be restricted to one class, but multiple class visits can occur in one day.

FIELD TRIPS!

Louisville Water offers tours at Louisville Water Tower Park and the WaterWorks Museum: 3005 River Road. Students will learn the story behind the treatment needed to make tap water. Included in your admission is a guided tour, time in the WaterWorks Museum, and an on-site lesson. Allow approximately 2 hours.

Cost is \$3 per student, \$5 per adult. Teachers are free.

Louisville MSD offers tours of the treatment facility at the Parklands of Floyds Fork: 1100 Blue Heron Road. Students tour the facility from intake to effluent and learn about the treatment process for wastewater. Weather-permitting, this will include a trail walk to the effluent site.

There is no cost for this trip. Tours are offered Tuesday-Thursday, between 9am and 1pm. Closed-toe shoes are required.

Visit these sites independently, or combine the locations for a full-day field trip.
